Lessons learned

- The Spelman model
 - A clear vision informs strategies and activities
 - Sustainable: connectivity, layers, redundancy
- Paradigm shift in US higher education
 - 'Inclusive Excellence'
 - Fixing the students > fixing the institutions
- Success in programs such as the Meyerhof program at UMBC
