CONSTRUCTION INDUSTRY CHALLENGES

- a. The reality on ground for rent-seeking thinking and practice.
- **b.** Shortage of trained and certified human resource
- c. Inefficiency in construction project management and technology transfer
- d. Inability to create an enabling environment for the strengthening of construction industry competency
- e. Inexistence of delivery chain process that would enhance quality of construction inputs and their sustainable delivery chain

CONSTRUCTION INDUSTRY CHALLENGES (cont'd)

- f. Inefficient process of financial and machinery supply for construction industry development and strengthening
- g. Unavailability of directives for synchronized joint operation by construction industry stakeholders for accelerated sector development
- h. Shortcomings of service delivery for building construction and utilization permit as well as inspection service
- i. Inexistent process for synchronized activities between and among various services and the construction industry.
- j. Failure to prepare and subsequently implement Construction Industry Development Program.
- ****** Quality of Construction industry leadership and management.




